Scripture: (Read with me)

Mk. 3:31-35

Jesus' Mother and Brothers

31 Jesus' mother and brothers came and stood outside. They sent someone in to get him. 32 A crowd was sitting around Jesus. They told him, "Your mother and your brothers are outside. They are looking for you."



33 “Who is my mother? Who are my brothers?” he asked.

34 Then Jesus looked at the people sitting in a circle around him. He said, “Here is my mother! Here are my brothers! 35 Anyone who does what God wants is my brother or sister or mother.”

Message:

Let’s talk about it.

In the passage that you just read, Jesus was not being rude when He asked who were His mother and brothers? Jesus simply wanted to describe that all the persons who love God are His brothers and sisters.

The first thing we want to recognize is that Jesus was always referring to everyone as brother and sister.

Let us start with the prayer that Jesus taught us. How did He start this pray? He said “Our Father...” He did not say My father, but “Our father, meaning that we all have the same Father, so are all brothers and sisters.

Jesus, at another time went on to talk about love for each other. Jesus emphasized that not only do we need to love God, but we should also love our neighbours as we love ourselves.

If you love yourself, you will want everyone to treat you well. Do you want others to say bad things about you? Do you want others to bully you? Do you want anyone to take your lunch or your money? If your answer is “no” to these questions, then you will not do these things to other persons.

Do you talk to other persons and how quickly do you make friends? When you went into Secondary School, how many children in your form did you know? Not many, maybe no one.

To make new friends, we need to consider that word ‘communicate’, or we can simply say ‘talk’. To make friends, we need to talk, simple conversation. I am sure that there are persons in your class, or even in your Sunday School class that you talk to a lot. Today we use a lot of Social Media, but we have to be careful with that form. Be kind and remember, do to others as you would want them to do to you.
