6 My friends, if someone is caught in any kind of wrongdoing, those of you who are spiritual should set him right; but you must do it in a gentle way. And keep an eye on yourselves, so that you will not be tempted, too. 2 Help carry one another's burdens, and in this way you will obey the law of Christ. 3 If you think you are something when you really are nothing, you are only deceiving yourself. 4 You should each judge your own conduct. If it is good, then you can be proud of what you yourself have done, without having to compare it with what someone else has done. 5 For each of you have to carry your own load.

6 If you are being taught the Christian message, you should share all the good things you have with your teacher.

7 Do not deceive yourselves; no one makes a fool of God. You will reap exactly what you plant. 8 If you plant in the field of your natural desires, from it you will gather the harvest of death; if you plant in the field of the Spirit, from the Spirit you will gather the harvest of eternal life. 9 So let us not become tired of doing good; for if we do not give up, the time will come when we will reap the harvest. 10 So then, as often as we have the chance, we should do good to everyone, and especially to those who belong to our family in the faith.

Let us talk about it:

Hello everyone. We are here again with the Apostle Paul. This time, Paul is writing a letter to the Galatians, a Christian community in Galatia. Examine the map in the Activities and you will find Galatia.

The passage that we are reading this week contains a host of advice Paul was giving to the Galatians about fulfilling the law of Christ. These things were not only meant for the Galatians, but are very applicable to us today. In this lesson we want to focus on bearing one another's burden. "What?" You may ask. "Why should I bear someone's burden?" But when we talk of

burdens here, we do not necessarily mean only a physical load, we must recognize there are many ways we can help someone.

Paul starts this chapter by telling us if we see someone doing something wrong, we have a responsibility to tell the person they are doing wrong, but we should do it in a pleasant way. Now, suppose you saw one of your classmates stealing money from another person's gym bag. What are you going to do? Should you approach the person stealing and tell him/her they are doing wrong? Should you go to the owner of the bag and tell him/her what you saw? Should you go to the teacher and report what you saw? Or should you turn your face in the other direction, and pretend you saw nothing? If you decide to turn and walk away and pretend you did not see, then you would have committed what we call the sin of omission. What is that?

A sin of omission simply means that you have failed to do what is right. It involves a willful act of doing something which violates God's commands. In our scenario, it would be the same thing as lying or stealing, simply because you have seen someone do something you know is wrong and refused to do anything to stop it.

By making a report, or simply talking to the person stealing, you are not only helping the person who stole the money, but you are also helping the person whose money would have been stolen. Can you imagine the anguish of the victim when the person realizes the money was stolen? The person may have had that money for lots of reasons. Just think, if it was your money, what will you do? Paul wants us to realize we can help each other by being honest. Paul goes on to tell us in verse 7, that no one can make a fool of God. He says that whatever a man sows, he will reap. God sees everything. A person who steals is also putting him/herself in line for being a victim of theft or maybe something worse than theft. Even you who saw the act and did nothing, you may be putting yourself up for a similar deed to be done against you.

Paul wants us to realize that we have a duty towards each other, we need to look out for each other, we need to help each other. We must help the person who is doing wrong. There may be reasons why the person is stealing. Paul wants us to continue doing what is right. In verse 9, this was our memory verse on January 24; So let us not become tired of doing good; for if we do not give up, the time will come when we will reap the harvest. You could be proud of being the person who prevented someone from stealing. You could be proud of being the person who prevented a person from losing a sum of money. Look at how you could have helped two persons, just by caring, by showing love, by helping a person in need. As the song says "If I can help somebody as I travel on, then my living shall not be in vain." Help someone who is on the wrong path, and you surely will fulfil the laws of Christ. Let our living not be in vain. Let us choose to do good at every opportunity. Let us love each other with a Godly love.
