November 8 – Do not kill

Scripture:

Exodus 20:13 You shall not kill. (RSV)

Message:

To think of killing yourself or others is wrong. To actually kill yourself or others has its consequences and you will be punished according to the law of God and the law of the land. The commandment says that you shall not kill and rightly so since we cannot create a life, we should not end a life. God is the only one who can create life.
