IN CELEBRATION OF BLACK HERITAGE MONTH

SIR FRANK WORRELL



Frank Mortimer Maglinne Worrell was born in Bank Hall, Barbados in 1924, but died in his adopted country, Jamaica, in 1967. In cricket he was a part of the West Indies Cricket team with the famous 3 Ws – Worrell, Weekes and Walcott. He became the first black man to captain the West Indies cricket team. For his contribution to cricket, Frank Worrell was knighted in 1964. He was the first cricketer to have a funeral service in Westminster Abbey, following which thousands of Barbadians gathered to watch as his body arrived home for burial. His remains are interred on the hill at the University of the West Indies Cave Hill Campus.
