MORAVIAN HISTORY (CUSTOMS)



THE CHRISTINGLE! PART 1

The word 'Christingle' means Christ-Light'. The word Christingle most likely comes from the German word "Christkindl", meaning "Little Christ Child", referring to Jesus. The tradition of the Christingle began in the Moravian Church in Germany in 1747. "Some believe the name is a combination of "Christmas" and "ingle" (an old Scots word for fire). This interpretation aligns with the symbolic meaning of the Christingle, which represents Christ as the "Light of the World".

Christingle services are often held during Advent to symbolize hope in darkness at Christmas, focusing on Jesus' birth as the light of the world or in Epiphany, emphasizing God's light for all people.





- 3. From the Provincial Board:
 - 3.1. Hurricane Melissa:
 - Jamaica and across several of our Caribbean neighbours are truly heartbreaking. Our support for the Jamaica Province is already underway. Rev. Neilson Waithe is currently in Jamaica providing counselling and logistical assistance. The Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province is actively exploring additional ways to assist our sisters and brothers during this difficult time. Their needs will be many as they begin the long process of rebuilding their lives. While we await a detailed assessment of the specific items required, we can already offer meaningful help through financial gifts. As you are able and as the Holy Spirit leads, you may contribute through your congregation or Conference. All funds received will be forwarded directly to the Jamaica Province to aid in the recovery

- effort. Monetary gifts of any size are deeply appreciated. Your generosity will serve as a tangible reminder to our Moravian siblings that they are not alone we stand with them. Let us continue to lift our brothers and sisters in prayer as they navigate this season of loss and rebuilding. Our brothers and sisters in Jamaica are currently assessing the full extent of the damage. Due to limited access to some affected areas, the situation remains uncertain. What is clear is that they will need significant support through tangible and intangible means. The Provincial Board is already in communication with the Jamaica Province and the work has begun.
- 3.1.2. In the meantime, let us pray for all those affect by Hurricane Melissa that they will not lose their hope in God and that God will make ways for them despite this tragic disaster.
- 3.2. The Provincial Board invites the prayers of the Province for the Grenada Mission. As they continue to minister faithfully in Mount Tranquil, Grenada, they are without the immediate presence of a Pastor. For the next two Sundays, Bro. Daniel Mark will be there to provide pastoral leadership and presence. Sis. Adelyn Mgonela from the St. Kitts Conference will do the same for the following Sunday. There will be a similar arrangement next month providing pastoral leadership and presence. As you pray, please also listen for God's call on how you may support the Grenada Mission with your presence or your resources.
- 3.3. The service of Consecration for Bishop Elect, Rev. Ezra Parris, will be held on Sunday, November 16, 2025, at the Sharon Moravian Church in Barbados at 4:00 p.m. Bishop Dr. Conrad Spencer, and Bishop Dr. Kingsley Lewis of the Eastern West Indies Province, and Bishop Stanley Clarke of the Jamaica and Cayman Islands Province, will officiate. Please pray for Bro. Parris and family and the officiating Bishops as they prepare for this solemn and sacred moment.


