MORAVIAN HISTORY (FAITH)



THE FAITH JOURNEY! PART 1

As early as 1987 the Barbados Conference had considered extending its work to include St. Philip. In 1990, the Barbados Conference, as part of the anniversary celebrations of 225 years of worship, witness and work decided that a new congregation in St. Philip should be established. The Laymen's League was invited to work with the Evangelism and Outreach Committee on this project.

Permission was sought for the use of the Princess Margaret Secondary School as a meeting place. Subsequently the community was invited to attend the first Service on Sunday July 22, 1990 at 9:00 am in the Hall of the school. Rev. Willard Prout, the then minister at Mt. Tabor, was charged with pastoral oversight for the Fellowship. Bro. Alban St. Hill, not yet an ordained minister, provided the relevant lay leadership of the Fellowship. In July 1992, Bro St Hill was appointed Lay Pastor in charge of the Fellowship.

THE FAITH JOURNEY! PART 2

In December 2017 the Fellowship attained the requisite number of communicant members to be recognised as a congregation and was accorded Congregational Status with effect from February 01, 2018, taking on the name Faith Moravian Church.

In 2010 one acre of land was purchased at Six Roads from Foursquare Plantation and on March 01, 2015, the ground-breaking was held for the Construction project of the new church. On November 25, 2018 the building, Faith Moravian Church, at Six Roads in St Philip, was dedicated by the Rt. Rev. Dr. Kingsley Lewis in the presence of a packed congregation.

This congregation has already produced one (1) pastor in the person of the Rev. Kirk Roger Barker, who currently serves in the Antigua Conference.

3. From the Provincial Board:

- 3.1. **The Provincial Board will convene its final scheduled meeting for 2025 in the Barbados Conference from November 12-15, 2025. Please pray for us as we seek God's guidance in finalizing plans for 2026 and beyond. Following the conclusion of the Board meeting, the service of consecration for the Rev. Ezra Parris will be held on November 16, 2025, at the Sharon Moravian Church at 4:00 p.m. Please pray for Bro. Parris, all involved in this worship service, and the entire Provincial family, that the Holy Spirit may challenge and encourage us in the work of ministry.**

3.2. Hurricane Melissa:

- 3.2.1.** This past week, Hurricane Melissa caused significant destruction across Jamaica and other Caribbean islands. Many areas in Jamaica, including places of strong Moravian impact and witness, have suffered severe damage. Members in these areas have been left without basic supplies, and some suffered major property loss. The devastation has also affected houses of worship with at least two of their historic cut-stone sanctuaries having been totally destroyed.
- 3.2.2.** Our brothers and sisters in Jamaica are currently assessing the full extent of the damage. Due to limited access to some affected areas, the situation remains uncertain. What is clear is that they will need significant support through tangible and intangible means. The Provincial Board is already in communication with the Jamaica Province and the work has begun.
- 3.2.3.** In the meantime, let us pray for all those affect by Hurricane Melissa that they will not lose their hope in God and that God will make ways for them despite this tragic disaster.
- 3.3.** The Provincial Board invites the prayers of the Province for the Grenada Mission. As they continue to minister faithfully in Mount Tranquil, Grenada, they are without the immediate presence of a Pastor. For the next two Sundays, Bro. Daniel Mark will be there to provide pastoral leadership and presence. Sis. Adelyn Mgonela from the St. Kitts Conference will do the same for the following Sunday. There will be a similar arrangement next month providing pastoral leadership and presence. As you pray, please also listen for God's call on how you may support the Grenada Mission with your presence or your resources.
- 3.4.** The service of Consecration for Bishop Elect, Rev. Ezra Parris, will be held on Sunday, November 16, 2025, at the Sharon Moravian Church in Barbados at 4:00 p.m. Bishop Dr. Conrad Spencer, and Bishop Dr. Kingsley Lewis of the Eastern West Indies Province, and Bishop Stanley Clarke of the Jamaica and Cayman Islands Province, will officiate. Please pray for Bro. Parris and family and the officiating Bishops as they prepare for this solemn and sacred moment.

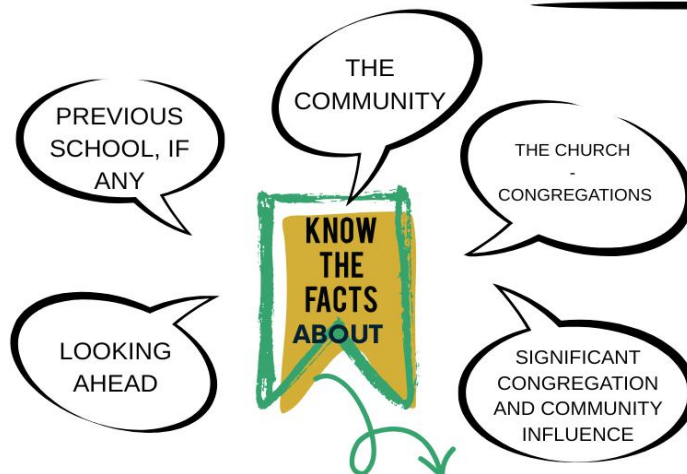

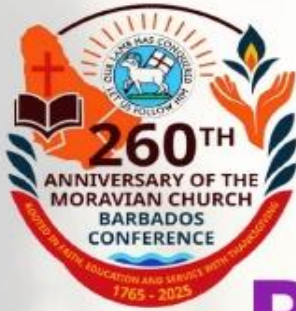

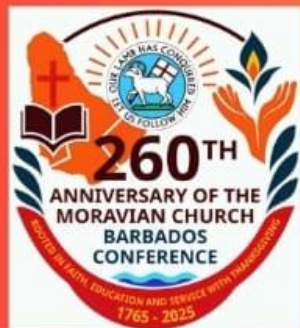
