Ministry of the Word First Scripture Reading – Jeremiah 23: 23 – 29

23. Am I a God at hand, saith the LORD, and not a God afar off?

- **24.** Can any hide himself in secret places that I shall not see him? saith the LORD. Do not I fill heaven and earth? saith the LORD.
- **25.** I have heard what the prophets said, that prophesy lies in my name, saying, I have dreamed, I have dreamed.
- **26.** How long shall this be in the heart of the prophets that prophesy lies? yea, they are prophets of the deceit of their own heart;
- **27.** Which think to cause my people to forget my name by their dreams which they tell every man to his neighbour, as their fathers have forgotten my name for Baal.
- **28.** The prophet that hath a dream, let him tell a dream; and he that hath my word, let him speak my word faithfully. What is the chaff to the wheat? saith the LORD.
- **29.** Is not my word like as a fire? saith the LORD; and like a hammer that breaketh the rock in pieces?



Second Scripture Reading – Hebrews 11:29 – 12:2

- **29.** By faith they passed through the Red sea as by dry land: which the Egyptians assaying to do were drowned.
- **30.** By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.
- **31.** By faith the harlot Rahab perished not with them that believed not, when she had received the spies with peace.
- **32.** And what shall I more say? for the time would fail me to tell of Gedeon, and of Barak, and of Samson, and of Jephthae; of David also, and Samuel, and of the prophets:
- **33.** Who through faith subdued kingdoms, wrought righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions.
- **34.** Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, waxed valiant in fight, turned to flight the armies of the aliens.

- **35.** Women received their dead raised to life again: and others were tortured, not accepting deliverance; that they might obtain a better resurrection:
- **36.** And others had trial of cruel mockings and scourgings, yea, moreover of bonds and imprisonment:
- **37.** They were stoned, they were sawn asunder, were tempted, were slain with the sword: they wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins; being destitute, afflicted, tormented;
- **38.** (Of whom the world was not worthy:) they wandered in deserts, and in mountains, and in dens and caves of the earth.
- **39.** And these all, having obtained a good report through faith, received not the promise:
- **40.** God having provided some better thing for us, that they without us should not be made perfect.

Hebrews 12

- 1. Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,
- 2. Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.


