

First Scripture Reading – Proverbs 25: 6 – 7

- **6.** Put not forth thyself in the presence of the king, and stand not in the place of great men:
- 7. For better it is that it be said unto thee, Come up hither; than that thou shouldest be put lower in the presence of the prince whom thine eyes have seen.



Second Scripture Reading – Luke 14: 1, 7 – 14

- 1. And it came to pass, as he went into the house of one of the chief Pharisees to eat bread on the sabbath day, that they watched him.
- 7. And he put forth a parable to those which were bidden, when he marked how they chose out the chief rooms; saying unto them.
- **8.** When thou art bidden of any man to a wedding, sit not down in the highest room; lest a more honourable man than thou be bidden of him;
- **9.** And he that bade thee and him come and say to thee, Give this man place; and thou begin with shame to take the lowest room.

- **14.** And thou shalt be blessed; for they cannot recompense thee: for thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just.
