Ministry of the Word:

Old Testament Reading – Daniel 3: 8 – 25

8. Wherefore at that time certain Chaldeans came near, and accused the Jews.
9. They spake and said to the king Nebuchadnezzar, O king, live for ever.
10. Thou, O king, hast made a decree, that every man that shall hear the sound of the cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, and dulcimer, and all kinds of musick, shall fall down and worship the golden image:
11. And whoso falleth not down and worshippingeth, that he should be cast into the midst of a burning fiery furnace.
12. There are certain Jews whom thou hast set over the affairs of the province of Babylon, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego; these men, O king, have not regarded thee: they serve not thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou hast set up.
13. Then Nebuchadnezzar in his rage and fury commanded to bring Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. Then they brought these men before the king.
14. Nebuchadnezzar spake and said unto them, Is it true, O Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, do not ye serve my gods, nor worship the golden image which I have set up?

15. Now if ye be ready that at what time ye hear the sound of the cornet, flute, harp, sackbut, psaltery, and dulcimer, and all kinds of musick, ye fall down and worship the image which I have made; well: but if ye worship not, ye shall be cast the same hour into the midst of a burning fiery furnace; and who is that God that shall deliver you out of my hands?
16. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, answered and said to the king, O Nebuchadnezzar, we are not careful to answer thee in this matter.

NEWS, INFORMATION & REMINDERS

1. From the Superintendent re the Provincial Pension Plan:
 - 1.1. The Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province has launched an appeal to heal the pension plan for Ministers of the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province.
 - 1.2. At the 34th Provincial Synod recently held in Trinidad in July 2025, delegates received an update on the serious condition of the Pension Plan. The PEC informed that “some pastors, having given over forty years of service, now face uncertainty about receiving a pension. Additionally, three of our pastors currently receive less than 50% of the pension due to them. Another six pastors have reached retirement age and are awaiting a response from the insurance company. This predicament leaves them not knowing if they will have any income for retirement. As a Church, we agree that all our ministers should retire with dignity and have the means to live in today's economy.”

- 1.3. By way of this appeal, we hope to bring relief to those currently receiving less than their due pension and to reduce the deficit of the Provincial Pension Plan.
- 1.4. For this year, 2025, we are appealing to you make a contribution of \$100 on November 30, 2025. *(Thanks to all who responded to the Provincial Pension appeal; some \$2,600 were received at Sharon).*
- 1.5. The appeal will continue in 2026 and will be maintained over a seven-year period, the proposal being a monthly \$10 donation or \$120 annually.
- 1.6. Thank you for your assistance and your ongoing focused prayer regarding this matter.
2. From the Provincial Board:
 - 2.1. The Provincial Board will meet in Antigua from January 26-February 2, 2026. During this meeting, the annual Provincial Board and Superintendents meeting will be held from January 27-29, 2026. Please pray for these meetings and all involved, that the plans and purpose of God will prevail and that the mission of God in this church will be accomplished.
 - 2.2. Sister Anthea Barrow who has been in the call process in the Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province and is a member of the Bethlehem Congregation in the Barbados Conference, has accepted a call to serve as Associate Pastor of the Cedar Hall and Cashew Hill Moravian congregations in the Antigua Conference. Sis Barrow will serve with Rev. Denise Smith-Lewis. This call takes effect from February 16, 2026. Please pray for Sis. Barrow, the Antigua Conference, and the Cedar Hall and Cashew Hill family as they make this transition.
 - 2.3. Rev. Erwin Warner who currently serves as the Superintendent of the St. Kitts Conference, Pastor of the Bethesda Moravian Church, and Minister of Christian Education for the St. Kitts Conference, has accepted an amended call to serve as Pastor of the Ebenezer Moravian Church in the St. Kitts Conference along with his current call. This call takes effect from February 1, 2025. Please pray for Bro. Warner and family and the St. Kitts Conference, particularly, the Bethesda and Ebenezer congregations, as they make this transition.
 - 2.4. Hurricane Melissa:
 - 2.4.1. The images of the devastation caused by Hurricane Melissa in Jamaica and across several of our Caribbean neighbours are truly heartbreaking. Our support for the Jamaica Province is already

underway. Rev. Neilson Waithe is currently in Jamaica providing counselling and logistical assistance.

2.4.2. The Moravian Church Eastern West Indies Province is actively exploring additional ways to assist our sisters and brothers during this difficult time. Their needs will be many as they begin the long process of rebuilding their lives. While we await a detailed assessment of the specific items required, we can already offer meaningful help through financial gifts.

2.4.3. As you are able and as the Holy Spirit leads, you may contribute through your congregation or Conference. All funds received will be forwarded directly to the Jamaica Province to aid in the recovery effort. Monetary gifts of any size are deeply appreciated. Your generosity will serve as a tangible reminder to our Moravian siblings that they are not alone – we stand with them.

2.4.4. Let us continue to lift our brothers and sisters in prayer as they navigate this season of loss and rebuilding.

2.5. The Provincial Board invites the prayers of the Province for the Grenada Mission. As they continue to minister faithfully in Mount Tranquil, Grenada, they are without the immediate presence of a Pastor. For the next two Sundays, Bro. Daniel Mark will be there to provide pastoral leadership and presence. Sis. Adelyn Mgonela from the St. Kitts Conference will do the same for the following Sunday. There will be a similar arrangement next month providing pastoral leadership and presence. As you pray, please also listen for God's call on how you may support the Grenada Mission with your presence or your resources.

2026 New Year Message From the Provincial Elders Board

January 3, 2026

Brothers and Sisters, warm Christian greetings.

As we stand at the threshold of a new year, the members of the Provincial Board extend heartfelt greetings to every leader and member of our Provincial family. With deep gratitude to God, we pause to reflect on 2025, a year marked by blessings, challenges, achievements, and important lessons, all undergirded by God’s unwavering faithfulness.

As a Provincial family, we mourned the passing of two of our clergy – Sis. Julie Joefield-Parris and Sis. Yvonne Jean. We honour their faithful service and commend their lives to the gracious care of God. We continue to hold their families and congregations in prayer.

We also continued the important and necessary work of addressing the clergy pension plan. Our commitment remains firm: those who have served faithfully should retire with dignity and without fear. This is sacred work, and we are resolved to get it right.

Among the highlights of 2025 was the 34th Provincial Synod, a historic gathering hosted for the first time by the Trinidad Conference in the 57-year history of this Province. We commend the leadership, membership, and the Synod Planning Committee for their excellence and hospitality.

At that Synod, Rev. Ezra Parris was elected Bishop of the Unity on July 14, 2025, and was later consecrated on November 16, 2025, at Sharon Moravian Church in Barbados. We continue to pray God’s wisdom, strength, and grace upon his ministry.

We extend sincere appreciation to the Synod Executive – Sis. Liselle Roberts, Chair; Sis. Cicely Athill-Horsford, Vice Chair; Sis. Bonnie Smith, Secretary; and Sis. Alicia Ross-Floyd, Assistant Secretary, who guided the proceedings with grace amid time constraints, technological challenges, and robust discussions.

Our Chaplain, Bro. Cortroy Jarvis, ensured that Synod was anchored in worship and nourished by timely and faithful proclamation of the Word.

We also express deep gratitude to the legal advisors Bro. Colin Derrick of the Antigua Conference and Sis. Amerelle Francis of the Trinidad Conference, whose legal expertise continues to be a vital ministry to the Church. Your service reminds us that ministry extends well beyond Sunday morning. We further thank our other advisors – Bro. Neilson Waithe, Sis. Cherice Job, and Sis. Carol David-Kendall and honour the faithful service of retiring Board members Sis. Deborah Moore-Miggins and Sis. Evannie Jeremiah.

Responding to staff shortages resulted in changes in the Grenada Mission. We thank Bro. Daniel Mark for accepting the additional responsibilities to offer pastoral oversight to the Grenada Mission supported by the Tobago and St. Kitts Conferences and we continue to pray that God’s people will answer the call to ministry.

Looking ahead, we sense God calling us to greater faithfulness and wiser stewardship. With rising costs and declining memberships, the financial gap

facing ministry continues to widen. Yet we trust that God has already made provision through people, partnerships, and property. In 2026, efforts will intensify toward developing income-generating projects, and the Provincial Board remains open to ideas and partnerships in this regard.

Over the last triennium, we journeyed under the theme SHIFT – Reclaiming our Identity, Renewing our Purpose, Re-igniting our Passion. That work continues. As we enter the next triennium, we do so under the theme:

- ✠ Grounded in Faith, Growing in Grace, Going in Power – Moving as One.
- ✠ To be Grounded in Faith calls us to intentional discipleship. Each congregation must commit to nurturing faith through small groups, congregational teaching, and Conference-wide initiatives. As Colossians 2:6 – 7 reminds us, we are to be rooted and built up in Christ.
- ✠ To be Growing in Grace is an invitation to maturity - to reflect the heart of God to one another and to our communities. Grace makes the Church a place of healing, welcome, and hope. As 2 Peter 3:18 urges us, we are to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- ✠ To be Going in Power calls us to Spirit-led, outward-focused ministry – bold obedience to the Great Commission. We dare not go in our own strength but empowered by the Holy Spirit. This is a call to action, commitment, and holy courage.

All of this originates and culminates in Moving as One. Unity is not optional; it is essential. Across multiple islands and contexts, we must choose collaboration over contention. As Moravians, we affirm: In essentials, unity; in non-essentials, liberty; in all things, love.

Each Conference will determine how this theme is lived out locally, even as common benchmarks guide us collectively. Let us therefore commit ourselves anew to faithfulness, action, and unity.

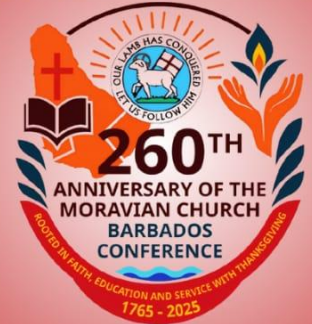

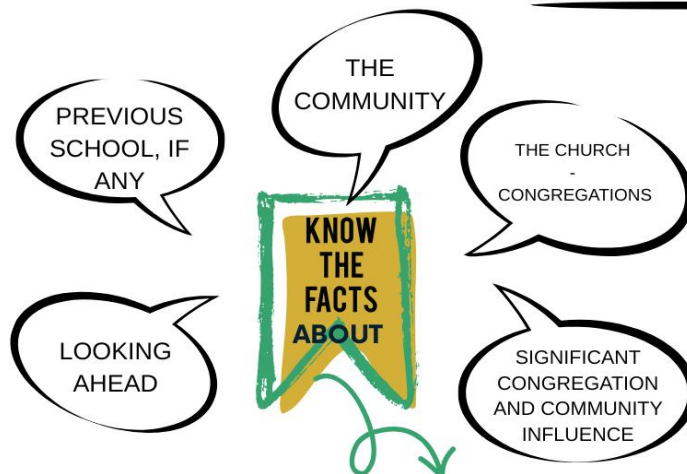
