# MORAVIAN History



#### **BUNKERS HILL!**

Moravian mission work in Barbados began in earnest in 1767 when Brother Benjamin Brookshaw from Bedford, England arrived in Bridgetown in May of that year. After a month, he was invited to St. Thomas where, with the help of an estate owner, Mr. Jackman, he was able to Minister successfully to a group of slaves at Bunkers Hill. This location is a historic site where the remains of Brookshaw and other early missionaries are buried. It is recognised as the site of the first Moravian Church on the island.





# MORAVIAN HISTORY



#### THE MISSIONARIES

On September 6, 1765, Brothers John Wood and Andrew Rittmansberger arrived in Bridgetown from Herrnhut, Germany. They were sent by the Moravian Missions Board which saw Barbados as their next mission field. Unfortunately, despite their good intentions, that first effort was doomed to failure as Brother Rittmansberger died of a fever on October 15 and Brother Wood who was left alone lost courage and abandoned the mission. Meanwhile, the Mision Board called Brother Fozzard of Fulneck, Yorkshire, England to replace Brother Rittmansberger, but he, too, died of a fever within a week of his arrival in June 1766.





#### THE ADVENT STAR!

This Advent star was first displayed in the Herrnhut Church, Germany on the first Sunday of Advent in 1891. While we are most familiar with the white star, the first stars had alternating red and white points - the red points representing Christ's love and sacrifice, echoing themes of redemption and the blood shed for humanity, The star became a symbol of the Moravian Church, and it is appropriately displayed in all churches from the first Sunday in Advent (the fourth Sunday before Christmas) until the Festival of Epiphany (January 6th)
