

NEWS, INFORMATION & REMINDERS

- 1. The Women's Fellowship will hold a Farmer's Market immediately after Church on Sundays. Seventy-five percent (75%) of the financial proceeds will go to the Church to be used as needed. Items will cost either \$3.00 or \$5.00.**
- 2. For our Brown Offering on Sunday, September 25th, some \$1,505 was collected. We say thank you to all who responded. The plan is to have a colour Sunday each quarter as we seek contributions towards repairs to our church building. The next one, a Purple Sunday, is planned for the Third Sunday in December. We invite attendees to wear purple and to present a walk-up offering of purple Barbados currency.**
- 3. You are reminded of the important role the Choir plays in leading and enlivening our song in worship to God, and conveying to our hearts the message of the Gospel, on a weekly basis. You are invited to add your voice to this ministry. Please express your interest to the Director, Bro Kevin King.**
- 4. We are in need of people to serve on our Media Team. Here is opportunity to be trained and then to engage in an important ministry to our congregation. Interesting persons should contact Sis Kristina Carter.**

Moravians Missions

In 1735 work commenced in Surinam. When the missionaries attempted to preach to the slaves as they had done in the West Indies, they were opposed by both planters and government officials. Undeterred they moved about a hundred miles into the jungle and settled in the heart of Indian country. Many missionaries died of fever, it became known as 'the country of death,' yet the work continued and there are now some 56,000 connected with the Moravian Church.

In 1737 an appeal was received in Herrnhut to send missionaries to South Africa where the Hottentots, Kaffirs and Bushmen were for the most part ignorant of Christianity. George Schmidt, one who had suffered imprisonment in Moravia for his faith, was chosen to go. At first he made little progress, but when he did have some success and began to baptise his converts, the Dutch State Church challenged the legality of his work and ordination, and in 1744 he had to leave. It was nearly 50 years later before the mission was restarted. The work has grown and the South African branch of our Church now has a membership of some 99,000.

Between 1732 and 1742 more than 70 men and women from a community of not more than 600 had answered the call to mission service, many knowing that they were going to take the place of those who had died of fever and other

tropical diseases, and that they might well suffer the same fate. Not all projects were successful, but failure never detracted from the vision.

Protocol for Worship Services during the COVID-19 Pandemic – 2022

In an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19 during our gatherings, the following is to be observed:

- 1. All attending shall sanitise their hands upon entering the church. Sanitisation stations have been set up at the entrances and exits.**
- 2. Face masks are optional but recommended, given the singing and speaking that is engaged in during worship. Attendees are asked to be respectful of others in their choice to wear or not to wear a mask.**
- 3. There shall be no physical contact between attendees.**
- 4. There shall be a physical distance of at least three (3) feet between all attending except between members of the same household who may sit together; in which case, there shall be a distance of at least three (3) feet between one group and adjacent groups or individuals.**
- 5. Attendees shall be asked to deposit their offerings in fixed containers.**
- 6. Bibles, hymnals, leaflets or other materials should only be shared by family members**
- 7. The Lectern Bible has been removed and lesson readers shall be asked to use their own Bible.**
- 8. Infant Baptism, Confirmation, and rites involving the laying on of hands or anointing have been adjusted to exclude contact between individuals.**
- 9. Windows and doors shall be kept open to allow for ventilation.**
- 10. Attendees shall be asked to maintain the recommended social distance when leaving the building.**
